Have you ever wondered when a dog is intently sniffing the ground, what and how they are smelling. All of us have seen on T.V. or in person, dogs searching for something using their nose.

Nose work is an upcoming and fun canine sport / activity. Nose work, also called scent work, is a companion dog sport where dogs are able to use their innate and amazing sense of smell and natural hunt drive, to find “hides” in a variety of locations and environments requiring a range of problem-solving skills. Based on professional dog detection, nose work uses essential oils as target odors. These odors include birch, anise, clove, cypress and vetiver. It’s a fun and addictive sport as handler start to understand and appreciate the beauty of this incredible talent dogs have to detect and follow a miniscule vapor of odor back to its source. Dogs love it because it’s what they are born to do regardless of age, breed, temperament, size or condition. It has been demonstrated that shy, fearful, and even reactive dogs can build the confidence to help overcome some of their challenges in the engagement of this highly enriching game.

We’ll take you through benefits of nose work, its history, how dogs smells compared to humans, interesting facts and how a dog searches.

After learning about the background of nose work, we will provide a short demonstration with one of our dogs. Come and join us for an informative, fun filled presentation.

FILLER FROM OLD NEWSLETTERS:

SIXTY YEARS AGO, 1964 - The annual dance had 174 paid admissions, giving the club a total of \$259.00. After expenses, which included 5 half-barrels of beer, a case of soda, the band, one bartender, and the hall rental, the club ended up with a profit of \$90.00

SIXTY EIGHT YEARS AGO, NOVEMBER 1956---Our first "News Bulletin" was mailed out to the membership of our newly formed chapter. Our president, Demo Staver stated in the bulletin that our intentions were to form a club, which was democratic in nature and belonging to NO ONE but the MEMBERS themselves for their mutual enjoyment while participating in a great and rewarding hobby. We have left the door open for YOU (all of us) to get behind your club and make it the biggest in the country, so COME TO THE MEETINGS and MEETS. There is nothing that kills a club as fast as poor attendance and lack of participation.

TWENTY TWO YEARS AGO, 2002 - Secretary Rich Miller reported the club has 387 members, and the members who joined the Wisconsin Chapter from January, 1998 to June, 2002 comprised 25% of the membership.



'A' trip Back to February 1995



In 1995 our President was Dave Boucher, assisting the president was Vice President was Roger Olsen. Erwin Haban was our recording Secretary and Dennis Wacker served as Treasurer.

Our board meeting held on Feb. 9 was hosted by the Grundmans

Our Feb. 12 Indoor meet, hosted by Ed and Lorraine Schultz, saw the By-laws committee present revisions for approval. Also, everyone was to bring a dozen of your best chocolate chip cookies to be judged by a panel of "experts". Entertainment was provided by a barbershop quartet.

Feb. 18 was the first Saturday Swap Meet for bicycles, motor cycles and parts. IAt was held at the State Fair Park, South Exhibit Building, chaired by Dan Kane.

Feb 19 was the 30th annual Greater Milwaukee swap meet for car parts. It was also held at the State Fair Park and the chairman was Dave Dohmeyer.

Feb. 25 was a Technical Seminar field trip to Richard Falluca's Antique Engine Rebuilding Company in Skokie, Illinois. We met in the parking lot of Brookfield Square with doughnuts and coffee to start the day. We travelled in a Wisconsin Coach bus, with refreshments. Lunch was at McDonalds at your own expense.

When Henry Ford introduced the Model A, his first all-new car in 19 years, he gave the first example to his close friend and mentor, inventor Thomas Edison. At Edison's request, the car was rebuilt with an open touring-style body, and Ford made further updates over the years. Edison used this Model A until his death in 1931.

According to press releases in 1928, actress Mary Pickford got the first Model 'A' Ford delivered anywhere in the world, a 1928 Sport Coupe. It was given as a Christmas present to her from hubby Douglas Fairbanks, Jr.

Henry Ford didn't get his personal, black with red striping, Special Coupe until 1929. He was loyal to his Model 'T' until the bitter end. It was a customized 'A' with several experimental parts.

Chop and Potato Bake (*Mary Gurgul, from Wi Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking*)

6 pork chops	1/4 tsp. pepper
Vegetable oil	1 (24 oz.) pkg. thawed hash browns
10 3/4 oz. can cream of celery soup	1 c. (4 oz.) Cheddar cheese
1/2 c. milk	2.8 oz. can Durkee French fried onion
1/2 c. sour cream	



Brown pork chops in lightly greased skillet. Sprinkle with seasoning salt and set aside. Combine soup, milk, sour cream, pepper and 1/2 tsp. salt. Stir in potatoes, 1/2 c. cheese and 1/2 can French fried onions. Spoon mixture into a 9 x 13 inch baking dish. Arrange pork chops over potatoes. Bake, uncovered, for 40 minutes at 350 degrees. Top with remaining cheese and onions. Bake uncovered five minutes longer.
